At the most recent ATV Maine meeting, on December 9, 2017, the ATV Maine Directors voted in favor for ATV Maine to reimburse the members for the additional liability insurance premium costs incurred, including sales tax, who purchased the ATV Maine liability insurance through V&V Insurance during 2017 and 2018.

As a result of increasing the coverage to meet the aggregate limit of \$2,000,000.00, to be in compliance with a number of land owners, the yearly club premium price was increased by \$200.00, with sales tax in the amount of \$36.00 added to this policy.

To date, (21) clubs have been reimbursed



Greetings ATVers!

While the ATV season is winding down outside, we are busy planning next year's season. For the past few years, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife has organized a free snowmobile weekend where any person, as long as that person's right has not been revoked, can operate a snowmobile for free without holding a current snowmobile registration. Due to a new law passed in the Legislature there will be a free ATV weekend beginning in 2018. The Commissioner of IFW has authority to set the dates.

Here is what you need to know:

- A free ATV weekend for nonresidents will occur on Friday, Saturday and Sunday August 10-12, 2018.
- During this time frame a nonresident (person from another State or Province) may operate in Maine on an ATV that is not registered in Maine as long as the nonresident's ATV has a current and valid registration from another state or a Canadian province.
- This information can be found on the IFW website located at: http://www.maine.gov/ifw/atv-snowmobile/atv/laws-rules.html
- Please note that the commissioner still has authority to grant special ATV event permits so long as the applicant provides a request in writing to the commissioner 60 days prior to the event and submits a map of the trails to be used during the special event.



While many parks, facilities and services associated with these agencies are free, some require a fee. Recreation fees, authorized by the Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act, enable federal land management agencies to reinvest in the management of various recreation sites.



NEW! for Mobile Download - 2018 Maine ATV & Snowmobile Laws



The 2017-2018 Summary of Maine ATV and Snowmobile Laws is now available digitally!

The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is now providing the ATV & Snowmobile laws digitally. Printed copies will no longer be available. Here's why:

It's convenient. Even without cell or internet service, smartphone users can access their predownloaded law book to check a technical rule, confirm registration fees, etc. If you always keep your phone on you (and charged) to take photos or use the GPS, this is a no-brainer.

It's easy. Save yourself the trip to Town Hall, and simply follow these instructions:

- From your iPhone: In Safari, go to mefishwildlife.com Click the link for the PDF you want to download. When it opens, tap on the first page, then tap Open in iBooks. The file is now saved in your iBooks app.
- From your Android: In Chrome, go to <u>mefishwildlife.com</u> Tap on the menu (3 dots) on the right, then tap Download. The file is now saved to your Downloads app. (some Android users will also need to download the Adobe Acrobat Reader app).
- From your Computer: Go to <u>mefishwildlife.com</u> to save a copy and/or print just the pages you need.

It's flexible. You can download the full law book. You can also look up specific laws or rules any time on our website.







ACTIVITIES

FISHING

The clear, spring-fed waters of Junior Lake and the eleven other surrounding lakes of the West Grand Lake Region are teeming with over a dozen species of fish including landlocked salmon, smallmouth bass, whitefish, trout, and perch to name just a few. Junior Lake is a 3,866 acre,



"two-tier" lake offering both warm and cold water fishing, and considered by anglers worldwide to be the premier fishing destination in the Northeast. We have the only boat ramp on Junior Lake and our guests have free access to it. The connected lakes are also highly rated by fishermen, and you can fish directly from the shore, rent a boat from us, or bring your own boat and discover your new favorite fishing spot. In winter months, ice fishing is also excellent on Junior Lake.



ATV RIDING

ATV enthusiasts have been coming here for many years to take advantage of the many miles of trails and old logging roads. Explore the trails on your own, or plan a longer trek on Maine's club-maintained trails.

HUNTING

Wild Fox Cabins is located on 155 unspoiled acres of some of the most fertile hunting grounds in the Northeast. Both large and small game hunting is permitted and abundant numbers of moose, bear, deer, coyote, and smaller game such as rabbits and grouse inhabit the area. There is also an adjacent 300,000 acres of conservation land with additional bountiful wildlife habitats.

BOATING, CANOEING, KAYAKING

There are few places on earth as gorgeous as this part of Maine. Untamed woods, sparkling, water, and distant mountains provide a majestic backdrop, and one of the best ways to enjoy it is from the water. By fishing boat, canoe or kayak you can venture into the water, ways and small islands found on the lakes. Many of the islands have campsites. HIKING


A relaxing hike along the many nature and hiking trails is one of the most popular ways to enjoy our picturesque grounds, and the scenery changes with the seasons. Don't forget your camera, you may see a moose or two, and other species like deer, pine marten, beaver, and otter. There are over 185 varieties of birds, including warblers, loons, American black ducks, Canada geese, and Bald Eagles. In the Fall, dramatic seasonal foliage explodes with colors. "Leaf Peeping" here is unrivaled anywhere in the country.



SNOWMOBILING, SNOW-SHOEING & CROSS COUNTRY SKIING

When winter sets in, guests enjoy ice fishing and other cold weather sports. There are 133 miles of nearby snowmobile trails groomed by local clubs, and connections can be made to the legendary Maine Interconnected Trail System (ITS). Cross-country skiing and snow-shoeing are also very popular in this part of Maine.

GETTING HERE FROM BANGOR

Take I-95 north 42 miles to exit 227 Lincoln (US-2/ME-RT6/ME-116) and turn right. Go 4 miles and turn left at the light onto US-2/ME-6. Follow ME-RT 6 East for 33 miles, passing through down-town Lincoln and Lee. In Springfield, turn right onto Bottle Lake Road. Go 6 miles and turn right onto Depot Rd. Go 1.5 miles and turn left onto East Shore Rd. In 1.5 miles turn left onto Middle Rd. Go about ½ mile and you will see the first

gate for Wild Fox Cabins, continue through the gate for about 1.5 miles until you arrive at the cabins.
