UPDATE ON LEGISLATION

LD 39

An Act To Clarify Landowners' Liability Regarding Public Access

SUMMARY

Under current law, liability for recreational or harvesting activities is not limited for an injury suffered in any case where permission to pursue any recreational or harvesting activities was granted for a consideration other than consideration paid to the landowner or the landowner's agent for use of the premises on which the injury was suffered, as long as certain conditions exist. This bill provides that liability is not limited where permission was granted for a consideration other than consideration paid to the landowner, the landowner's agent, lessee or sub-lessee or the holder of an easement from the landowner, as long as certain conditions exist.

Status - Ought Not to Pass

LD 112

An Act To Further Limit the Liability of Landowners Who Permit the Use of Land for Outdoor Recreational Activity

SUMMARY

Current law limits the liability of landowners who allow certain outdoor recreational or harvesting activities on their land, as long as the land is not primarily used for commercial recreational purposes. This bill extends that limited liability to landowners who allow their land to be used for the construction, maintenance or expansion of trails or ancillary facilities used to pursue outdoor recreational activities.

Status - Ought Not to Pass

LD 277 - ATV Maine did not support -

An Act Regarding the Use of Helmets by Minors Riding in an All-terrain Vehicle with an Adult - Rep. Paul Stearns of Guilford
Subjects: RECREATION, ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES, HELMET REQUIREMENTS

SUMMARY

This bill provides an exemption to the requirement that a passenger under 18 years of age on an all-terrain vehicle wear protective headgear. The bill allows a parent, grandparent or legal guardian of a passenger to operate an all-terrain vehicle while the passenger on that all-terrain vehicle is not wearing protective headgear when the passenger is under 8 years of age and is riding directly adjacent to the operator on an all-terrain vehicle with side-by-side seating.

Status - Ought Not to Pass

LD 41 - Once presented and defined – ATV Maine did not speak on -

An Act To Exempt a Person under 18 Years of Age from the Requirement To Wear a Helmet While on an All-terrain Vehicle in Certain Circumstances -

SUMMARY

This bill exempts a person under 18 years of age from the requirement that the person wear a helmet while operating or being carried as a passenger on an all-terrain vehicle when the person is wearing a seat belt and the all-terrain vehicle is equipped with roll bars or bracing welded or attached to the frame in a permanent manner, with a roof or with a protective enclosure.

Status - Divided Report – likely not to pass

LD 191 - Working together with MSA, ATV Maine supported – to include amendment

An Act To Authorize 3-day All-terrain Vehicle Registration Reciprocity with the Provinces of New Brunswick and Quebec

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following: 'An Act To Allow Open Snowmobile and All-terrain Vehicle Weekends and Events'

The bill allows a nonresident having a valid all-terrain vehicle (ATV) registration from another US state or Canadian province to operate their ATV in this State, without obtaining state registration, during an annual 3-day weekend established by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. Any loss of revenue to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.

Status - Ought To Pass As Amended – to be one weekend statewide – No reciprocity - just a free weekend at the decision of the Commissioner of IF&W. This will apply to all States and Provinces, not just New Brunswick and Quebec as originally presented. Snowmobile law was also amended to work the same.

UPDATE ON LEGISLATION

LD 631 - ATV Maine did not support -

An Act To Require an Operator of an All-terrain Vehicle Driven on Certain Roads To Have a Driver's License and Liability Insurance - Rep. Paul Stearns of Guilford Subjects: RECREATION, ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES, DRIVERS LICENSE REQUIRED ON CERTAIN ROADS

SUMMARY

This bill requires an operator of an all-terrain vehicle who travels more than 500 yards on a public way designated as an ATV-access route to possess a valid driver's license and motor vehicle liability insurance for the ATV.

Status - Divided Report – likely not to pass

LD 1246

"An Act To Provide Landowners a Property Tax Exemption for Certain Trails"

SUMMARY

This bill provides an exemption from property tax for a recreational trail crossing a parcel of land as long as the trail is a recognized trail that is open to public recreational uses, such as snowmobiling, hiking or all-terrain vehicle use, and meets certain width and length requirements, depending on the use. The exemption is limited to that portion of the parcel of land that is actually used for the recreational purpose.

Status - Ought Not To Pass

LD 662

Resolve, Directing the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry To Work with All-terrain Vehicle Clubs To Develop All-terrain Vehicle Trails in Northern Maine

SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to work with all-terrain vehicle clubs to develop all-terrain vehicle trails in northern Maine.

Status - Ought Not to Pass

LD 1252

An Act To Permit the Operation of Certain All-terrain Vehicles on Public Ways

SUMMARY

This bill allows the operation of an all-terrain vehicle, or ATV, on a public way as long as the ATV is registered and meets specified safety equipment requirements and the operator is licensed and has insurance. This bill establishes an annual registration fee of \$33, the same as for ATVs under current law that are not permitted on a public way.

This bill prohibits the operation of an ATV on a public way with a posted speed limit of more than 50 miles per hour. The Department of Transportation may adopt rules or a municipality or county may adopt an ordinance to restrict or prohibit the operation of an ATV on a way if the department, county or municipality determines that the restriction or prohibition is necessary in the interest of public safety.

Status - Ought Not to Pass

LD 1391 - ATV Maine supported

An Act To Ensure the Continuation of the Landowner Relations Program

SUMMARY

This bill proposes to identify long-term funding needs and possible funding sources or the landowner relations program within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

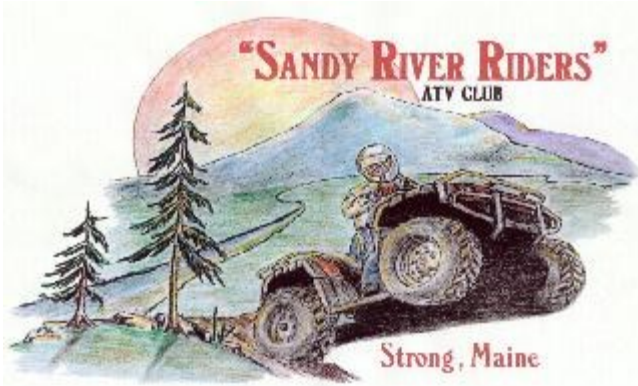

ATV Maine *High Mileage Club*

“Club Challenge”

The ATV Maine High Mileage Club “*Club Challenge*” is an extension of the High Mileage Club. This is an opportunity for ATV Clubs to challenge each other to determine which club can achieve the highest **average** mileage for all registered machines. We will take all of your registered machines, total the mileage per machine, and then calculate the average mileage per machine per club. The club with the highest average mileage then wins the “*Club Challenge*” prize at the end of the year.
