

NEWS

We received word from the State of Maine on June 10 that our request for a Municipal Grant was approved for much of the funding amount we requested. This is a reimbursement type of funding for monies we spend on trail maintenance. We are grateful to the Penobscot County Commissioners - our Municipal partner/sponsor - for working with us on this venture. Trail Master Randy and President Vinal appeared before the Town of Milford Select Board on June 6 to petition for an increase in ATV speed limit on County and Call Roads. The Board voted and granted an increase from 15 mph to 25 mph "*where there is no sidewalk*", that being from the named road intersections with Pine Street, continuing further eastward out of Milford. All other in-town access roads shall remain at 15 mph.

Similarly, roads maintained by Penobscot County have now been approved for an increase to 25mph as well. However, roads in Hancock County (Myra Road for last 1.5miles<u>+</u> and the gravel road into Nicatous) remain at 15mph per our permission agreement with Hancock County.

We are thankful for our local business partner Alexander's Mechanical Solutions who have agreed to let us use their gravel parking lot as a Park & Ride location, on the weekends. With the number of employees they have and with trucks coming and going during the weekday hours, we decided that park & ride on <u>weekends only</u> was best for both of us.

And, don't forget that the County Road Market is also an official Park & Ride location and a great place to stock up on supplies before heading out for a day on the trails.

We had our first annual open house event at the clubhouse on June 3. Coffee, donuts, homemade sweets, hot chocolate, soda and chips were served up. A good number of folks stopped by throughout the day for food and great conversation.

During the Open House, we had raffles for a lightly-used yard-size chainsaw [donated by Avery Saw Shop] which was won by Fuzzy Cyr, and a patriotic cornhole & beverage tub combo which was won by Creag Tuttle. During the Open House, trail masters Randy and Dave spent their day building directional and information kiosks for our trail system. Five were placed at strategic intersections with the help of RMTR member Creag Tuttle that day, and since another five have been placed. Thanks so much, guys!

Discussions are ongoing to create a new trail that connects Milford and Bradley via a via public recreational land. The primary challenge is the need for a 100' bridge over Great Works Stream and of course the environmental permitting associated with such a project in this type of location. It is our understanding that active community member Brian Wilcox has been involved with the entire process since concept and was instrumental in getting the project off the ground. He plans to continue to work on getting the project approved (hopefully) and we will assist however we can.

At the beginning of the season, Trail Masters Randy Brown and Dave Soucier, along with volunteers, assessed some of the RMTR trail system for any winter/spring damage and for needed signage during the week prior to American Forestry Management (AFM) opening up their gates to the 50+ miles of our trails on the lands they manage. AFM opened their roads on May 15. At that time, we were able to finish our trails assessment. Found were two severe washouts at culvert crossings and a number of sign needs. Thankfully, AFM repaired the washout damage. We were told harvesters would be using the roads for logging during the summer, so as always, watch out for logging trucks and other vehicles when out wheeling. All other trail damage was repaired or adequately signed as caution by our awesome trail masters and volunteers. All our trails were deemed passable and safe to ride. They officially opened on May 22.

A QUICK NOTE FROM THE TREASURER (WE NEED MONEY)

I would like to begin by thanking everyone for their tremendous support. When the new officers started in April there was less than \$100.00 in the account. As of May 31, 2023, the club is current on all payables, this includes power, property insurance, property tax, 2022 Hancock County grading, ATV Maine membership, and trail liability insurance. This has been made possible by membership submissions, miscellaneous donations, and sponsorships.

Expected payables in the future include the 2023 Hancock County grading, continued ATV Maine memberships, and of course trail maintenance. As will be reported we were recipients of a Department of Conservation municipal grant. The funding approval is up to \$36,000 with the club match of \$4,000. 
FUN FACTS
